Role Of Drama In The Present Scenario

The World that we expect in the presentment time is mention as 'Present-time' is nothing but the outcome of complex situation mostly dominated by political controls and economic gains which lead to be 'trivial' of Man in his completeness. All the plays of Vizai Bhaskar are entertaining and enlightening. As a matter of fact, his plays are touching to the heart as well as thought provoking one to the readers. His sharp vision on relations of human beings and his analysis on the ways of the world are indeed amazing and unique in nature. He believes the concept of

He leaves no stone unturned while giving expression to his feelings on the human nature in all its nakedness. His dramatic world is not only an expression of art but also becomes a realization of life and it may be regarded as a preface to the tradition of unconventional popular, Indian theatre. Vizai Bhaskar is known for his gifted genius in writing the dramas in Telugu and which are translated into English and several other Indian languages. It is to his greatness that he is one of the

greatest budding dramatists of Indo- Anglican literature.

His plays are generally originated from his own philanthropic conscience that he has developed towards down-trodden and exploited in the current society. In addition, his plays deal with ethical values and he agonizes deeply on the deteriorating human relations, unidentified virtues. Ruthwik, Kalakootam, the Return of Gandhi, the Chair, and Riding the Tiger are his plays translated into English.

'Ruthwik' is a renowned and experimental play in Telugu. Ruthwik (i.e. saint), the protagonist is the main character highlights the evils of the society pungently by mixing in the main story, at proper places in the play. This play reflects the necessity of ethical living in the modern times. Human being's responsibility in living with ethics and wisdom is the main theme of this play. His aim to see the society as unified. He desires that the whole mankind should not be torn by strife in the name of caste, creed and religion etc.

Another play 'Kalakootam' deals with the conflict between two politicians who deprive the real meaning of democracy and incorporate the current political system. The title of this play has been originated from the mythical concern. It represents the state of the people in Indian democracy. The protagonist Rajaramdas observes that the Indian electorate is hiding the destructive realities of the leaders which are more poisonous than kalakootam in their throats. Throughout the play, the author used innovative techniques to show the miserable actions of the leaders.

The Return of Gandhi is another societal play, deals with the rot

in the present political system that is being run by deception in political class. In which his experimentation of the rebirth of Gandhiji's appeals the attention of all. The Playwright has utilized the Hindu belief of rebirth as a technique and brought back Gandhiji to Earth and to India to witness all the evil practices in politics as well as in daily routine of People.

The Nandi award winning play 'Chair' reflects the importance of love and anxiety for an orderly society that comes with the gaining of affluence and greater respect. It broadly deals with the subject of political reservations given to the Dalits in India. Even though the line of reservation granted to Dalits to empower their living standards the economic and social conditions became hindrance to their growth.

'Riding the Tiger' this play associates with the practices of factionism in the Rayalaseema region of Andhra Pradesh State and how this terrible deed plays with innocent followers of landlords to uphold the power of them. In the play, Vizai Bhaskar's talent of showing these innocent followers at a time as both heroes and villains is an admirable one. These riders of the tiger do not know that they would be tormented by the same tiger once they stop riding it. In this short play, Vizai Bhaskar presented the elements like violation, conspiracy, treachery and manipulation of human motives.

Vizai Bhaskar introduces multiple literary techniques like dialogues, parallelism and art of characeterization. He is possessed with the gift of observation and the knowledge of the social condition. He has the ability to present his views in simple and effective language.
